Following a meeting with the developer the parish council has considered the revised plans for the Brambles, Babcary and we have no objection. We had concerns over the overall impact of the high and imposing facade on the street scene and the developer has addressed these issues by removing the pitched gable roof from on top of the timber/glass two storey porch.

vi) Newlands Farm Lane To The West Of Newlands Lane Babcary SomersetRef. No: 23/00800/FUL | Received: Tue 21 Mar 2023 | Validated: Wed 26 Apr 2023 Change of use of land to mixed agricultural/equestrian and construct stables building, straw barn, outdoor arena and horse walker | Status: Awaiting decision

The Parish Council considered the plans for a change of use and a substantial stable block plus equestrian workers dwelling at Newlands Lane, Babcary. No objections but a few conditions. The plan involves the construction of a very large two storey stable block and a house in the unspoiled swathe of open farmland of Foddington Vale; small fields, rich in wildlife, dark and quiet which we wish to see protected. Nevertheless we felt that the application was genuine and that, subject to various conditions, it would be acceptable. Lighting: no outside floodlighting. All external light to be kept to an absolute minimum.

Hours of operation: these should be limited to the normal working day (apart from the owners own provision of 24/7 on site care).

Flooding: this is a very low lying area and full risk assessment needs to be undertaken to ensure that the development will not result in surface water flooding of the road. S.106 agreement: The use and ownership of the equine workers dwelling and the stable shed must be tied together.

Screening: the stable block should be properly screen from the road by planting of tree screen in addition to the existing hedge.

Traffic: visitors/deliveries to the site should be encouraged to access via the A303 from Sparkford rather than through Babcary.

#### 3) Correspondence

i) Community Funded 20mph Speed Limits (*Gary Warren* Service Manager - Traffic Engineering) Somerset Council want to support communities who wish to fund the design and implementation of a 20mph speed limit. It is estimated that the cost would be in the region of £15,000. You will be required to pay a £500 non-refundable application fee which will cover an initial assessment including up to 2

no week-long speed data readings. These will be charged at £200 per location and will be included in the final cost of the scheme.

Mr Sketchley canvased local responses to the above speeding initiative, responses were mixed, many felt in favour of further action. The parish council considered the latest offer from Somerset Council for speed limit zones in villages but did not find it viable. At a cost to the parish of £15,000 we could have a 30mph zone in the centre of the village only. A 20mph zone would not be permissible due to the results of the speed monitoring survey done last year and a move to 30mph would, if anything, lead to an increase in median speeds. A "central Babcary" scheme would not deal with the speed issues at Perry Hill, Steart Lane or Foddington and residents would need to be willing to have speed limit signs on their property and pay for a hike in the parish council tax. Highways have been asked to look at the Foddington speed issue with a view to extra signage.

  Recently informed by collections contractor, SUEZ UK that members of the Unite union intend to start industrial action from Wednesday 12 July, striking on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday for four weeks.

#### **WEATHER REPORT**

June was the second driest month this year so far with Babcary receiving 26mm of rain mostly falling between 17<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> of the month. There was no rain recorded for the first 16 days.

Rainfall fell consistently throughout July with Babcary receiving 112.4mm (4.4 inch) – this being regionally the sixth wettest July since records began in 1891.

Surprisingly, reservoir stocks continued to fall to 79% capacity for Wessex Region but this was marginally higher than this time last year.
