#### **Draft Minutes**

# Babcary Parish Council Monday 13<sup>th</sup> January 2025 8pm at The Hut

Present: Mr Simon Hoar, Chairman (SH), Mr Philip Sketchley, Vice Chairman (PS), Mrs Glynis Kingston (GK), Mrs Vee Vyner (VV), Mr Graham Hughes (GH), Mr Damien Pick (DP),

Mr Henry Hobhouse, County Councillor (HH), 1 Member of the Public (MP) and Mrs Jasmine Tucker, Parish Clerk (JT).

#### 1) Matters Arising

- iv. DP raised issue of pull-ins around Babcary Village having been destroyed by increased traffic flow from new Dual Carriageway. SH reported that Somerset Council are speaking to the A303 contractor about this.
- v. Pipe Repair adjacent to Olive Farm Lane, Foddington Road, Babcary PS can now report that the repair to the drains and under road pipe work was eventually completed w/c Dec 16th and that the drainage is now, at long last, working correctly. However,
  - 1) Damage to stopcock covers to water mains, Wessex Water have shown concern ref damage to their asset, meeting in regards planned with John Nicholson, Assistant Highway Service Manager for the end of January.
  - 2) Covering of the ends to the new pipe, zero structural integrity.
  - 3) Curvature of tarmac onto adjacent road, poorly finished, concerns that continued heavy usage & weather will quickly degrade the area.

BPC awaits comments and feedback on our observations.

Since BPC meeting on the 13<sup>th</sup>, Mr John Nicholson has responded to confirm the afore mentioned meeting with Wessex Water to rectify damage sustained through initial works & to confirm the works have yet to be signed off or paid for.

iii) Pot Holes, 19 Pot Holes were photographed and reported this month to www.somerset.gov.uk

Sunny Hill Farm & Dilkes Lane Potholes being amongst the most concerning holes, Council has highlighted them for fixing. Please note rectifying potholes cannot be undertaken by anyone outside of the County Council due to liability.

iv) Mel Goymer attended meeting to raise concerns about the use of Babcary church allotments. The allotments are not within the remit of the Parish Council and there are no planning issues and her concerns were referred to the Parochial Church Council. It was confirmed that there was plenty of space for more allotments if anyone else wanted one.

#### 3) Planning Consultation

  - Proposal: Application for a Lawful Development Certificate for a Proposed Use; The provision of a mobile home (caravan) within the existing lawful planning unit to provide additional accommodation for a family member as part of one household.
- ii) Impending sale of the Old Chapel fields. A preplanning enquiry has been submitted.

#### 4) Correspondence

- ii. Jacqui James, Bumblebee Conservation part of a research team from the University of Cambridge researching the benefits of meadow restoration for bumblebees in Somerset, focuses on the shrill carder bumblebee which has declined rapidly over the past 60 years and is now only found in five locations in the UK, one of which is in Somerset. Some research will be conducted on farmland in the parish of Babcary. Jacqui would like to let the local community know about the project. A short article about our bumblebee conservation research will be in parish newsletter/magazine.
- iii. Loud Music complaint, re The Red Lion dated 20/12/24, anonymous complaint noted.
- iv. Due to continuing severe weather in all areas of Somerset we are EXTENDING our Severe Weather Emergency Provision (SWEP).

This will be in place until the morning of Friday (10/01/25) when it will be reviewed. Severe Weather Emergency Provision in Somerset has two aims:

- To ensure that no one dies on the streets due to severe weather
- To ensure that every effort is made to engage individuals with support

#### **Weather Report**

#### November

Babcary received 82.6mm of rainfall during November, again higher than our long-term monthly average. Most of the rain occurred during the latter part of the month with Storm Bert giving us 38mm over the weekend of the 23rd/24th.

#### December

December marked a shift away from the wetter weather of the previous three months with Babcary receiving 38.3mm of rainfall mostly at the beginning and middle of the month. Our annual total for 2024 was 1032.4mm which is the highest on our records (going back to 1980) beating the previous record in 2012 by 31.8mm (1.25"). For the region it is the fifth wettest year on record since 1871.

#### **Steve Street**

#### From the archives

In April 2020 Babcary PCC unwittingly missed its centenary as the old leather bound minute records the first meeting of Babcary Parochial Church Council was held on 6<sup>th</sup> April 1920. PCCs were created by statute in 1921 to separate the church council's responsibilities from the civil parish council as the latter evolved into local government. The rector was joined by no less than 17 parishioners including Mr Creed & Mr Edwards the churchwardens, two Cannons and two Burtons, one of the latter being Levi Burton the sexton and clerk.

March 1921. Decided to install a 6<sup>th</sup> bell (the treble) in the tower. Funds to be raised

June 1921 The fete had raised £110.2s9d

Oct 1921 A bell chiming apparatus was to be purchased and installed by November

April 1923 Levi Burton was presented with 5 guineas on his retirement as clerk and sexton due to ill health. He lived at The Shieling and his horse and cart was the village taxi service.

#### Local bumblebee conservation research

The shrill carder bumblebee (*Bombus sylvarum*) is one of the rarest bumblebees in the UK. It was once found across much of England and Wales but has rapidly declined over the past 60 years, mainly driven by habitat loss. It is now only found in five locations in the UK, with Somerset being one of the last strongholds for the species. Researchers from the University of Cambridge, together with the Bumblebee Conservation Trust, are researching how farmland supports the shrill carder bumblebee and other insect pollinators in Somerset.

We will be surveying the wild pollinators in the local area over the spring and summer as part of the *Restoring pollinator habitats across European agricultural landscapes* (RestPoll) project. RestPoll aims to identify the best practices for wild pollinator habitat restoration to reverse wild pollinator declines, aiming to benefit species such as the shrill carder bumblebee, as well as stabilise pollination services and their benefits to us all.

The work is led by Jacqui James, a postgraduate researcher from Cambridge's Department of Zoology. We are looking for field sites in the local area to survey three times per year in 2025 and 2026 and have contacted some local farms and landowners. If you are interested in the project or are keen to know how you can help, you can email Jacqui at jasj3@cam.ac.uk.
