COMMITTEE REPORTS

PARISH COUNCIL

Draft Minutes

Babcary Parish Council Monday 10th February 2025 8pm at The Hut

Present:

Mr Graham Hughes, Acting Chairman, Mr Damien Pick, Mr Steve Street, Mrs Glynis Kingston, Mrs Vee Vyner, Mr Kevin Messenger (County Councillor) & Mrs Jasmine Tucker (Parish Clerk).

Apologies: Mr Simon Hoar (SH), Mr Phil Sketchley (PS) & Mr Henry Hobhouse (County Councillor).

1) Matters Arising

- i) Pothole Reporting, (DP), since partial fixing some potholes now require refixing, they should be guaranteed a minimum 2 years. Works were agreed by Keirs who are now subcontracting, fears that subcontractors are shirking their duty to complete satisfactory work. Workers seen on site flouting health and safety rules by wearing crocs & unfit for attendance.
- ii) Flooding, Baker Street & Others roads throughout Babcary, Gary Tubridy measured all time high of 2ft depth on Dilkes Lane, raised concern that lanes will not cope!

To be revisited March.

iii) Olive Farm repairs, Somerset Council contractor has indicated they will return the week of 17/02/2025 to carry out remedial works, revisit March.

2) Finance

- i. Capital Reserve Account stands at £13,653.57 Current Account balance £50.
- ii. £25 cheque raised in favour of Somerset Association of Local Councils.

3) Planning Consultation

- i. **Chapel Green**. Pre planning advice (not an actual planning application) has been sought for 9 dwellings for the two small fields between the Old Chapel and the Red Lion. The Jacksons, who are selling the site, kindly shared the response from Somerset Council and the planning officer's conclusion is quoted here verbatim.
- ii. "Ultimately, I would consider that the principle of residential development in what is a site within a sustainable location (as recognised under SS2 given the proximity to services) is considered acceptable. However, concerns regarding the provision of 9 dwellings as an attempt to avoid the requirement for affordable housing given the availability of land and proposed layout, including sizable, detached dwellings. Any future application should evidence why it would not be viable to provide 10+dwellings, or how the provision of 9 dwellings meets local need. Similarly, any future application should be accompanied by a detailed Heritage Statement detailing the impact on the Grade 2 Listed Public House and a Transport Statement to show that there would not be an adverse highways impact associated with the development".
- iii. VV noted that the 20mph limit mentioned in the advice is inaccurate, the road is delimited.

Asking for support requesting 10% maximum increases in rural areas, BPC confirmed they support this, Colin to keep BPC informed of any movement after next LCN Meeting (Local Community Network).

From the archives

Apologies for the cut and paste shambles in last month's extract!

The proceedings of the PCC continued at a leisurely pace through the 1920s. In Sept 1924 it was proposed that a funeral bier be purchased for the parish and a summer fete would be held to raise funds. By April 1925 almost all the money needed had been raised and by Jan 1926 the new bier had been received and placed in an enlarged shed in the churchyard. This horse drawn bier is now on display in Castle Cary Museum. Far from being a lovely piece of traditional wooden craftsmanship it is ornate, black and chrome, rubber wheeled and, to be honest, hideous. Nevertheless by Dec 1927 thanks were given to Mr Savery for making a cover for it and it was noted that £1-13-6d had been raised by letting the bier out to neighbouring parishes.

In March 28 it was decided to hold a garden fete on 28th June and the bishop's wife had written to say that she would be pleased to open the fete. In May the minutes "expressed great regret that the bishop's wife was unable to open the fete on account of the bishop's holiday.

Earlier in the year the Rev Kimber of West Bradley had come over to give a talk on his work with Red Indians. The Rector had spoken of his regret that the bells were not being rung and said that he and the churchwardens would try to raise a team. Obviously this bore fruit as by Sept 1928 it was decided that the bell ringers should be recognised for their services and it was agreed that they should be given a supper on New Years Eve, cost to be covered out of church funds.



WEATHER REPORT

January was a return to wetter weather following the dry end to 2024 with Babcary receiving 148.4mm (5.84 inch) of rainfall. Rain largely fell over a few days at either end of the month. This was more than double our long-term average for the month. There was significant local flooding during the first week of January.
