COMMITTEE REPORTS

PARISH COUNCIL

Draft minutes from Monday 15th September 2025 8pm at The Hut

Present: Mr Simon Hoar, Mr Philip Sketchley, Mr Steve Street, Mrs Glynis Kingston, Mrs Jane Diamond, Mr Kevin Messenger (County Councillor) & Mrs Jasmine Tucker (Parish Clerk).

Apologies: Mrs Vee Vyner, Mr Damian Pick & Mr Henry Hobhouse (County Councillor)

1) Matters Arising

- i) Pothole Repairs updates, none.
- ii) The Hut's revamp, hut now repainted, awaiting completion of curtains and playground equipment renovation.
- iii) The Parish Council confirmed renewal of Asset of Community Value (ACV) registration on The Red Lion, 5 year registration till June 2030.
- iv) The Local Government Boundary Commission, has recommended that Babcary moves to Ilchester ward instead of the current Castle Cary ward. The parish council agreed to object to this at last meeting (minuted July 2025) SH has voiced the appeal but as yet no reply from The Local Commission, KM to ask HH to further the BPC request.

- v) General village maintenance, Stones on verges causing damage to vehicles, legality disputed, Babcary sign at entrance to village requires repair, Horse signs requested & promised by county highways but they have not appeared yet, agreed over a year ago, PS.
 - Tracey Harris, replacement for John Nicholson has yet to respond SH to chase, KM suggested contacting John Nicholson.
- vi) GK, letter re Environment Agency notice of intention to stop maintenance of The River Cary on privately owned strip, Environment Agency Watercourse maintenance update.

KM raised concerns that previous stopping of river maintenance had resulted in flooding. Parrett Drainage Board unhappy with the withdrawal of Env Agency service.

Controversy re round-up spray being used on Somerset watercourses, PS to look into.

4) Correspondence

i) Babcary PC Website - quote for possible new domain, PS has been weighing up pros and cons for changing current supplier. Alternative supplier would be cheaper long term but substantial conversion costs. Alternative system much more user friendly and it would facilitate use by other parts of the Babcary community, eg. Cricket Club, Playing Field Committee, PCC and Comm Comm being able to have and update their own page. Agreed that this looked like the best long term option.

PS to delve further into.

JT to forward any other interested companies to PS for cost comparison.

- ii) Annual grit report, current stock deemed adequate.
- Speeding issues raised re Perry Hill road to Foddington. Previous concerns re high speeds throughout the village but doubt as to whether yet more signs or limits would impact on a minority who drive at excessive speeds. Speed tests in 2023 demonstrated very little speeding in the village and BPC funded 20's plenty signs. PS to ask other councils how they have got 30mph signs and do not have mandatory lights in order to qualify.
- iv) SALC Somerset Parishes 2025 AGM Conference, near Bridgewater Friday 3rd of October, book places now.

5) AOB

- i) GK brought up recurrence of off roaders in Babcary seen recently in North St.
- ii) KM queried if we can clear village drains, can this be done without moving drain lids, millions of £ needs to be saved on drainage debacle.
- iii) Suggestion of using what 3 words to note drain locations, people taking responsibility for drains next to their property and clearing (if superficial) or reporting if blocked.

Congratulations to Tina Hutchins and Graham Hughes who have both (quite independently) just completed the South West Coast Path. Jane and Gerald Brock completed it a while ago and others are well on their way. Indeed it is said that on any given day there are on average 0.75 Babcary residents somewhere on the coast path (AI generated statistic).

Somerset Council doesn't get much praise these days but we can report that they have thoroughly restored the Hunt Bridge on the round walk beyond the wildflower meadows and, unbidden, they also did some much needed maintenance work on the bridge next to it. It's all reopened now for walkers and riders.

From the archives



On the altar of the church is a huge brass cross. Less obvious is the inscription written on the base: In loving memory of: Lieut Cyril Amyatt-Burney, killed in action N.Nigeria, December 16th 1903. But who was he and why is it in Babcary church?

Fred Boothby did a bit of research and discovered that 25 year old Lt Amyatt-Burney was appointed District Superintendent of Police in Northern Nigeria. He was previously in the Imperial Yeomany during the Boer War. In December 1903 a force under the command of Captain O'Riordhan and Lt Amyatt-Burney was despatched from Deckina to reinstate the tribal king at Akina and oust the usurper. However, the force was ambushed by the natives and both O'Riordhan and Amyatt-Burney were slaughtered. His remains were recovered by a punitive expedition and buried in Lokoja cemetery.

And why here? Cyril Amyatt-Burney was the son of the rector of Babcary at the time; Rev Edward Amyatt-Burney. So, whatever the rights and wrongs of this obscure bit of colonial derring do, there's some corner of a foreign field that is for ever Babcary.

INHERITANCE TAX

Inheritance tax is currently charged at 40% on the value of your estate over the tax free allowance of £325k. WEATHER REPORT

July 40.5mm mostly during the middle of the month August 28.9mm almost all during the last week of the month.

This means for the last 6 months Babcary have only had around 20% of our annual rainfall. This has now been the second driest 6-month period for the Wessex Region (March to August) since records began in 1871.

Reservoir levels for Wessex Water were approximately 42% capacity at the end of August.
