"I wanted to inform the PC of the progress I have made with the wildflower initiative. So far 18 households have requested seeds. Several of the participants that have large visible verges, agreed to have the digger remove grass to ensure maximum benefit for everyone. In total seven larger sites have been prepared, with donations (not to full cost) made by 5 of them.

In addition, several others have also expressed their interest in participating in phase 2.

The initiative is looking to provide a public good (for the village and those passing through), and also contribute in a small way to biodiversity.

The cost of the seed is £350 and digger net of donations £450. If the PC would also like to make a contribution to the cost of the community project please let me know."
