PARISH COUNCIL

Babcary Parish Council
Monday 12th January 2026 8pm at The Hut

December 2025 Minutes agreed & signed.

1) Matters Arising

- i) Local Government Boundary Commission update, no further updates.
- ii) River Cary & Environment Agency Watercourse, ongoing, disputed maintenance regarding responsibilities & affiliated costs, no further updates.
- iii) General village maintenance, SH in consultation with Andy Baron (Somerset Council Highways) suggested reflector posts instead of commonly used stones or cones along roadsides, currently in consideration.
The drainage outside Grey Stones was noted as a flood point AB aware and looking into.
Telegraph pole outside Percy House has sustained damage, again a reflector has been suggested to stop this reoccurring, referred to BT, BT declined to make necessary changes unless their equipment is damaged.
Pot holes & gulley outside Broadacre Dilkes Lane have been rectified.
- iv) Payment for Dog Bins & bags, BPC or PFC, revised costs from council received, £338 plus vat per year, querying increased amount (JT to look into) messaging Jonathan Stevens, as per Somersetbinproject@somerset communication.
- v) Babcary.gov.uk email address required for parish clerk - no other parish members a statutory requirement.
PS to attend Assertion 10, training on 12/02/2026 giving further information on website requirements.
- vi) Village Bonfire and the Playing Field Committee update, meeting held 09/12/25
Annual Playing Field Committee Minutes supplied, key points Annual Bonfire to be more carefully monitored, fencing off car park area to prevent access to the bonfire itself whilst allowing normal access to community facilities.
Controlled access for depositing garden waste into a trailer near The Hut during Saturday Shops during October only, allowing supervision on hand to check EA guidelines are adhered to. Existing spoil heap to be removed when weather improves.
Aim to stop unsanctioned waste disposal.
- vii) Clerks & Officer Training, Jasmine Tucker to attend The Annual Governance Statement, including The New Assertion No 10, on 12th January, notable comments no more cheque book payments, PC should be moving on to online payments.

RESTART A HEART

22 people attended the Restart a Heart training session on 17th Jan on how to administer CPR and how to use a defibrillator – well done. Remember - if someone collapses:

1. Dial 999
2. Send someone to the old phone box to pick up the orange box with the defibrillator (it's not locked) and bring it to the casualty whilst you or someone else does CPR
3. Put a message on the resident's WhatsApp group and someone will come to assist with CPR

In our location we must expect to wait 20-30mins for an ambulance. Despite the excellent training course you don't actually need to be trained to use the defib – turn it on and it will talk you through everything and remember, you've nothing to lose - as technically the patient is already dead.



WEATHER REPORT

November

Thanks to Storm Claudia we received over 60mm of rain during the second week of November. The month ended with a total of 102mm. This was 130% of our long-term average. Reservoir stocks had started to recover and for Wessex were at 69% of capacity although this was lower than at the same time last year.

December

In December Babcary received 111mm of rain (132% of LTA) mostly falling during the first three weeks of the month. From Christmas until the new year we saw no rain at all. Reservoir stocks had recovered to almost 100% capacity.

Despite the period from March-August being regionally the second driest on record since 1871 the year finished with a total annual rainfall of 680mm compared to our LTA of 792mm. This was the driest year since 2011. For comparison we received 1033mm in 2024.
